The Junior Citizen Police Academy is a 10 week course designed to give students a better understanding of the Pasadena Police Department. Applicants must be either a junior or senior in high school. Classes will be held once a week from 5:30pm to 9:00pm at the **Pasadena Police Department's Community Room (1201 Davis Street), the Pasadena Police Academy at 4801 Spencer, and the Pasadena Police Range at 6060 Genoa Red Bluff**. This course will cover topics such as Criminal Investigations, Juvenile Investigations, DWI Investigations, Telecommunications, Police Pursuits, SWAT, Crime Scene Investigations, and more. Classes will consist of lectures, hands-on demonstrations, and Ride-Alongs. During the class participants will visit different aspects of the Police Department and see them as few other citizens have.

Our goal is to provide participants with information so that they can better understand the operation of the Pasadena Police Department, and how we can better serve you, our citizens. We are confident that graduates of the Junior Citizen Police Academy take their knowledge into the community and educate others as opportunities arise.

### Eligibility Criteria

- Applicant must be either a junior or senior in high school.
- Applicant must submit two reference letters with their application as well as proof of their grade point average.
- Background check: No person with a Class A misdemeanor or higher conviction, including a Family Violence conviction, shall be allowed to attend the class. A Class B misdemeanor conviction has a 10 year disqualification period. All disqualifiers shall remain concurrent to and consistent with the Texas Department of Public Safety's TCIC/TLETS ACCESS POLICY, October, 2003, or any additional policy amendments.
- Applicants will be automatically disqualified if you have any outstanding warrants or pending court dates in either Municipal, State, or Federal courts. You will not be allowed to attend the Junior Citizen Police Academy until such warrants are cleared and all cases are adjudicated.
- Once selected, students will be provided a polo style uniform shirt and be expected to follow a dress code.
- Students must be able to provide your own transportation to and from the academy.
- Students must be in class in time for roll call to be taken at 5:35 p.m. or you will be counted absent. Students who miss more than one class will automatically be dropped from the Junior Citizen Police academy.
